The BSc (Honours) in Accounting and Finance at Sunway University College, developed in collaboration with Lancaster University (LU), is officially accredited by the Association of Chartered Certified Accountants (ACCA) and is an excellent option to becoming an accountant. Graduates of the degree course will be given the maximum 9 subject exemptions from ACCA. This degree is also the ONLY Accounting & Finance degree in Malaysia to be given provisional exemptions in 8 papers by The Institute of Chartered Accountants in England and Wales (ICAEW).

Bright and promising students of the BSc (Hons) in Accounting & Finance are given opportunities to intern with world-recognised accounting firms including Ernst & Young, and to work with them upon graduation.

Internships, an element in all Lancaster University validated programmes

Internships, vital for grooming future careers, are part of the curriculum in all the Lancaster University validated degrees at Sunway. The IT and computing honours degree programmes have a compulsory four-month industrial training and some of the companies that have allowed Sunway students to serve internships are S'Factory, MIMOS, Telekom Malaysia, Siemens Malaysia and Sunway Resort Hotel & Spa.

The BSc (Honours) in International Hospitality Management and the BSc (Honours) in International Tourism Management respectively, prepare students to become managers par excellence in the hospitality or tourism management industry. Students must undergo 20 weeks of supervised work experience where they are placed with reputable events management companies, five-star hotels in Malaysia and the region, restaurants and travel agencies. The hospitality students are given ample opportunities to put their skills to test at events held at Sunway

University College.

Psychology honours degree students are encouraged to be involved in community work and this year they will help to organise the annual Sunway Academic Symposium. This is an excellent opportunity for students to learn from mental health professionals, counsellors and teachers to share and brew ideas on psychological research.
