

## Managing IP with ease



Intellectual Property (IP) is the legal property rights over creations of the mind, where owners are granted certain exclusive rights to a variety of intangible assets. IPs provide creators of original works economic incentives to develop and share ideas through a form of temporary monopoly. MIMOS always emphasises the importance of IP by encouraging its staff to generate novel patent disclosures, in line with the Government's drive towards building an innovation nation.

The Intellectual Property Management System (IPMS) is an integrated online IP management system that provides a central platform for IP-related activities. The system is developed in-house by MIMOS KHTP and funded by IP Management Department. Aimed at facilitating IP application process, the IPMS provides features that manage the IP processes within MIMOS and serves as the central bank for all IP data. It is expected to smooth the progress of IP activities to generate abundant innovative inventions in frontier technologies. The IPMS is scheduled to be soft-launched in Q4 2010.

## Making it happen: Urging on for IPs at Q2 Townhall

MIMOS President and Chief Executive Officer Dato' Abd Wahab Abdullah has pressed the alarm bell, signalling the need for MIMOSians to work harder to achieve year-end targets. "Commercialised IPs are still in the red," he remarked at the MIMOS Townhall meeting for Q2 held on Tuesday, July 20. The quarterly gathering was as usual held at the Tengku Datuk Dr Mohd Azzman Shariffadeen Auditorium, Seminar Room 1 & 2 at MIMOS TPM, and livecast to MIMOS KHTP via video conferencing.

After the routine singing of the national anthem and "Innovation for Life" song, Abd Wahab began his message by giving a quick update on funnel status and outlook. Addressing MIMOSians sans rostrum, he stressed on the corporate KPI for the year, taking stock of the RM1 billion target, of which RM550 million in market commitment had already been achieved to date through WiWi CPE Gen 1.5, iDOLA and iDOLA with iSDP. In the same vein, he also noted the high expenditure, and the importance and consequences of cutting costs.

Abd Wahab then noted that the government, specifically the Economic Planning Unit, was looking at MIMOS as a new growth area aligned with National Key Economic Areas (NKEA) identified in the 10th Malaysia Plan. The CEO also stressed on the significance of Centres of Excellence (CoE) and the importance of moving expertise to the CoEs to strengthen them towards achieving technology excellence. More CoEs are forthcoming soon, he said.

On Intellectual Property, the CEO said that activities had been sluggish this year and there was a clear need to beef up on disclosures. As at June 30, only 82 disclosures were submitted – 177 short of the December 31 target.

Abd Wahab also stressed on the need to have more papers presented at the international level in order to be a world class institution. He was quick to add that international presentations should not only be the concern of cluster heads but also the second echelon and aspiring leaders.

The CEO also touched on issues of corporate image and public perception

of MIMOS. "Every MIMOSian should have the keenness to be ambassador of the organisation, and start talking to people," he said.

As in previous sessions, the Townhall gave recognition to exemplary SATRIA1 Ambassadors, Six Sigma Achievers, as well as top IP contributors. Awards were presented to five SATRIA1 Ambassadors and four Six Sigma Green Belt achievers. Four IP contributors received Gold Badges while another four received Platinum Badges.

During the "Ask the SLT" segment, Chief Operating Officer En Abd Aziz Abd Kadir told the audience that the issue "commercialisation is more complex than creating technology" was not only faced by Malaysia but the whole wide world. He said that in MIMOS' case, it was not easy to get good technology recipients who want to deliver value and not only interested in making money. A new approach would be taken where MIMOS would go to the companies instead of them coming to apply from us, he said.

### MIMOS WiWi router production commences

September 23 was an auspicious day for MIMOS in particular the Wireless Communication Cluster as we launched the production of MIMOS WiWi Outdoor Access Point motherboard at the manufacturing site in Ijok, Selangor. MIMOS WiWi Outdoor Access Point is the first true hybrid wireless access router for WiMAX-Wi-Fi Customer Premises Equipment (CPE). It supports both the wireless Wi-Fi 802.11b/g technology as well as the Ethernet 10/100Mbps interfaces.

With the WiWi Outdoor Access Point, users will enjoy a true experience of instantaneous multi-user Internet access over Wi-Fi at the same time the consistent service of WiMAX 802.16e technology, or better known as last mile connectivity.

The automated build station streamlines MIMOS WiWi manufacturing, which includes testing, thus reducing operator training and the potential for mistakes. After the production and testing stage here, the motherboards will undergo final production at another centre in Sungai Petani.

### Ultra-fast link with IIUM launched



On September 2, MIMOS introduced its new MIMOS Ultra-fast TM Link for Advanced Research at International Islamic University Malaysia (IIUM). The new dedicated connection was jointly launched by MIMOS Chief Operating Officer En Abd Aziz Abd Kadir and IIUM Deputy Rector, Research and Innovation Prof Dr Ahmad Faris Ismail at IIUM Gombak Mini Auditorium.

MIMOS Ultra-fast TM is a dedicated fibre optics link connecting MIMOS and IIUM at a speed of 4Gbit/s using Coarse Wavelength Division Multiplexing (CWDM) technology. Under MIMOS Ultra-fast TM Link for Advanced Research, users at IIUM will be able to access High Performance Computing (HPC) applications under MIMOS Grid services. Apart from that, this link can also be used for Disaster Recovery Planning (DRP) and Business Continuity Planning (BCP) together with access to MIMOS Cloud Computing.

It is envisioned that this new high-speed connection will promote a virtual research community and enable more research collaborations between universities and MIMOS to produce outstanding quality and high-impact research outputs. MIMOS and IIUM had already established a CoE in Cyberspace Security at the IIUM campus in Gombak in October 2007.

## Sharing of latest Info Security developments at WEC 2010

At the Fourth World Engineering Congress (WEC2010) held on August 2-5 in Kuching, MIMOS was invited to lead the Conference in Information Security (CIS). The conference was the latest addition to the World Engineering Congress, which had eight other conferences that brought together engineers of various backgrounds from around the world.



LATEST ISSUES... Carrying the focal theme of "Engineering and Technology for Global Stability and Security", WEC2010 was jointly organised by Malaysian Society for Engineering & Technology (mSET), Federation of Engineering Institutions in Islamic Countries (FEIIC) and Universiti Putra Malaysia; and co-organised by MIMOS together with Jabatan Pengajian Politeknik, Ministry of Higher Education.

Chief Research Director of Advanced Information Security Cluster Prof Dr Mohamed Ridza Wahidin presented a keynote speech on "Designing the Ultimate Digital Fortress to Protect Organisations". The MIMOS-led CIS attracted about 40 participants, proving to a good extent that MIMOS was capable to co-organise a world event.

Overall, participants of the conference benefited by gaining international exposure and exchanging ideas with fellow participants as well as speakers. For the country, this spells a notable progress in R&D for secure and trusted communication channels through Information Security technology – a crucial factor that will contribute to the success of the 10th Malaysia Plan.

Under the MIMOS-IIUM collaboration, the two parties will develop Islamic finance content and an Islamic finance education system, while the MIMOS-e-Pulze pact will adopt the MIMOS semantic technology platform to develop a semantic-based sentiment analytics system using the Internet as the knowledge base.

CEO Dato' Abd Wahab Abdullah, who represented MIMOS at the signing ceremony, said semantic web was proving itself as a commercially competitive technology, and actual investment in its applications was fast gaining momentum worldwide. The challenge now was in taking semantic technology to the masses and making lives on the Internet exchange ideas and experiences. This year's event saw the participation of more than 30 speakers from leading research centres and business ventures from Australia, France, Germany, Hong Kong, United Kingdom and USA.

The event comprised three conferences including the International Conference on Conceptual Structures (ICCS 2010), which was being held for the first time in Asia this year. The other two conferences were home-grown, namely the Malaysian Joint Conference on Artificial Intelligence (MJCAI 2010) and Semantic Technology and Knowledge Engineering Conference (STAKE 2010). MIMOS Head of Knowledge Technology Cluster Dr Dickson Lukose was General Chair for both MJCAI and STAKE. Besides the conferences, there were also three workshops and nine tutorials.

The Microsystems and MEMS Cluster organised a two-day Workshop on Bio-MEMS Sensors beginning July 26. The Cluster had initiated this workshop and worked on it since January 2010. The event was funded by MOSTI.

The workshop was facilitated by Prof Marc Madou of the University of California at Irvine (UCI), with guest speaker Prof Ille Gebeshuber from Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia (UKM). After a welcoming speech by MIMOS Head of Microsystems and MEMS Cluster Prof Masuri Othman and opening by Chief Operating Officer Encik Abd Aziz Abd Kadir, Prof Madou began the workshop with a technical session.

Attended by 35 participants from MIMOS as well as scholars from public and private universities, the workshop discussed on state-of-the-art devices, materials, processes and technologies related to Bio-MEMS. The good discussions even carried on during the coffee breaks!

The workshop was closed by MIMOS staff researcher Dr Mohsen Nabipoor on July 27. The following day, a meeting was held to discuss on potential collaborations among MIMOS, UKM, Universiti Malaya (UM) and UCI; followed by a tour of the microsystems and MEMS labs.

Projects that have been successfully undertaken at the centre ranged from performance, functional, security, hardware reliability, wireless devices and network, to usability tests, including checks on user friendliness, said the centre's director Redzuan Abdullah (below) at a media briefing on the centre at MIMOS on July 17.



The centre offers a comprehensive test strategy; test management and quality assurance required for most software and hardware products. It includes three fully-equipped state-of-the-art laboratories, namely a system test lab, usability lab, and hardware reliability lab. The system test lab combined with the

usability lab allows MIMOS to offer robust, rigorous, scientific, independent end-to-end testing and consulting services.



The hardware reliability lab caters for extensive electrical, physical and mechanical hardware analysis in compliance to international yardsticks such as MIL, ISO, IEC and JEDEC testing standards. This means developers can now save time and money by using the facility to test their prototypes instead of sending them to the targeted markets overseas.

The centre collaborates with local and foreign higher learning institutions, organisations and multinational companies in conducting test research, automation and usability testing in Malaysia.

With world class facilities, domain expertise, certified test professionals and strategic collaborations, the centre is fast becoming the preferred end-toend and on-demand software and hardware testing centre and is well-positioned to ensure software and hardware products are of first-rate quality.
